

Alleluia! Christ is still rising!

During the 50 days of Easter Jesus appears many times to his disciples. It was both a confusing and an exciting time for them, a time filled with wonder and amazement. But Jesus didn't make himself known to the disciples just to dazzle them. Jesus was sending them out as witnesses to share the good news. I love the story of Mary Magdalene's encounter with the risen Christ. Jesus sends her to tell the other disciples the good news. Her first-person sermon to them is short and sweet, "I have seen the Lord!"

People today still need to hear, "I have seen the Lord!" Jesus tells us, "You will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). We are to tell people everywhere about Jesus.

What does a witness do? A witness just says, "Here's what I've seen. Here's what I heard." A witness tells other people the story of what God has done in their life.

One of the best ways to let other people know about the love of Jesus and what God can do in their lives is to tell them a story of what God has done in your life.

Are you unsure how to get started? You can start by writing out your story. Think about a defining moment in your faith walk, a "God moment," or a "God sighting" you have experienced. Write out your story, and then start sharing it with the people that are close to you. Then, God will give you the opportunity to share your story with someone who needs to hear the good news about what God has done for you.

I would love to hear your God stories! Send me your story or stop by the office to share it with me. There is a lot of bad news out there today. We have good news to share!

Come and listen...let me tell you what God has done for me" – Ps 66:16.


Join us Tuesday at 10:00 am for Bible Study. Ken Toop leads the group for interesting discussion.

Ezra 3:10-13

This passage reminds us to tend to the variety of emotions present as we tend to the work of innovation in the church today.




Stewardship For All Seasons

Church in Society:



Caring for Creation May Dare we think about starting our gardens?! When we do, we need to prioritize pollinators. Humans need pollinators to survive as all our food

sources depend on various pollinators. Remember:

*Plant flowers that bloom from early spring until late fall.

*Avoid choosing "designer" hybrid flowers, like double blooms where the showy blooms are selected for rather than the pollen and nectar.

*Eliminate pesticides as much as possible. Don't use the shotgun approach spraying for everything all the time. If you need some, use specifically what is needed, only where it is needed. Try to choose pesticides that are not poisonous to bees.

*Plant larval friendly plants and flowers. If you want butterflies, you also need to put up with their caterpillars, and be prepared for the nibbling that they will inevitably do. Choose an area where they might not be central focus.

Enjoy the beauty and productivity in your yard and garden that pollinators will provide. If we can help them, they will help us.

Hi All,


Good job everyone! Here's our feedback from the 500 kits we sent to Cambodia in February!
